GENERAL INFORMATION FOR TRANSATLANTIC PASSENGERS

- LIABILITY AND INSURANCE:** The liability of the Company for baggage is strictly limited by terms of Passage Contract Ticket. Passengers are advised to protect themselves with insurance. Baggage insurance policies may be obtained upon application to any Office or Agent of the American Export Lines or at the Pier upon embarkation, or at the Purser's Office on board the ship.
- VALUABLES:** The carrier is not responsible for loss or theft of money or valuables kept in storerooms. Money and valuables should be deposited with the Purser for safekeeping. A number of private safe deposit boxes are available free of charge.
- DOG KENNELS:** Passengers are requested to make reservations for dog kennels (when desired) at the time of booking their own passage. Passengers entering the U.S.A. with dogs or cats must be in possession of a Veterinary Certificate certifying that the animals are in good health and, in the case of dogs, also proof of anti-rabies inoculation.
- BAGGAGE:** Free allowances and excess, in addition to a reasonable quantity of hand baggage, each full-fare Passenger is allowed, free of charge, 35 cubic feet (or 275 lbs. or 135 Kilos) of space in the Hold. Excess is charged for at the rate of \$ 30 per cubic meter. Half fares proportionately.
- FORWARDING OF BAGGAGE** to the port of embarkation should be accomplished so that it arrives at least the day before sailing. Each piece of baggage should be addressed as follows:
(passenger's name) (vessel) (date of sailing)

c/o S.A. Espresso Bagagli, Stazione Centrale, NAPLES, or

c/o London Coal Co., 72 Irish Town, GIBRALTAR.
Passengers embarking at Genoa or Naples should hand over to the American Export Lines office or to Espresso Bagagli their railway baggage checks. This is necessary in order to arrange the withdrawal of baggage and its transportation from railway station to pier. Before embarkation, Passengers are requested to verify their cabin and hold baggage, to be present during customs inspection and to register their hold baggage. This is essential in order to avoid possible claims through loss of baggage.
- CHILDREN:** The age on day of sailing governs fare to be paid. Children under 12 months First class \$ 30.00; Cabin class \$ 10.00; Tourist class \$ 15.00. Children one to eleven years, inclusive, half fare. Children twelve years and over, full fare.
- SERVANTS** travelling in First class pay the rate of accommodation occupied less 30% when accompanying their employers. No reduction is allowed when travelling in Cabin or Tourist class.
- U. S. HEAD TAX:** All citizens are required to pay \$ 8.00 United States Head Tax when purchasing Westbound tickets, except:
(1) Children under sixteen years of age when accompanied by father or mother.
(2) Passengers in possession of a (2) visa or transit certificate visa, who actually depart from the U.S.A. within 29 days.
- SMALLPOX VACCINATION:** Passengers proceeding to the U.S.A., regardless of their nationality and of the class in which they are travelling, must be in possession of a valid certificate showing positive vaccination against smallpox within three years prior to arrival in the U.S.A. Such certificate must be signed legibly in pen and ink.
- CHERT X-RAY AND BLOOD TEST:** All citizens proceeding to the U.S.A. on immigration visa, also, Students, G. I. Brides and G. I. Wives, must be in possession of a chest X-Ray plate, a reading thereof, and a blood serological report, attached to the visa. Aliens entering with a temporary visa are not required to have these documents.
- HOW TO ARRANGE PREPAYMENT OF PASSAGES FROM EUROPE TO AMERICA:** Prospective Passengers resident in Europe may write to their relatives or friends in America to arrange with the Office of American Export Lines, Inc. to prepay their passage from Mediterranean countries to the United States. Requests may be addressed to any Office or Agent of American Export Lines, Inc. in Europe, giving the names and addresses of friends or relatives in America, and this Office or Agent will be glad to request our principal office in America, or its branch Offices, to contact the relatives or friends, advising them that payment is desired to be made covering passage to the United States.
